The Hop: Utilize Milwaukee's free streetcar to quickly and easily get around town. View the Hop schedule at *thehopmke.com*.

Water Street: One block west of campus lies a popular strip of restaurants including AJ Bombers, Qdoba, lan's Pizza, Buffalo Wild Wings, Starbucks and Mr. Taco.

East Point Market: About two blocks northeast of campus holds a collection of stops for a quick bite including Panera Bread, Noodles and Company, Jamba Juice, Jimmy Johns, Jersey Mike's and Starbucks.

Brady Street: A popular stomping ground for our students, Brady Street holds many options including Glorioso's Italian Market, King Crab Shack and Dogg Haus.

Cathedral Square Park: Relax outside at the southeast corner of campus, home to many summer festivals and events. Nearby restaurants and shops include Flannery's, Elsa's on the Park and Classy Girl Cupcakes.

MSOE's Grohmann Museum: Visit the world's most comprehensive art collection dedicated to the evolution of human work and enjoy campus views from the Rooftop Sculpture Garden. Free admission for students, alumni and parents.




