At MSOE, we know that many of our students are facing significant challenges due to the ongoing pandemic. The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) under the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 Pub L. No 116-94, was passed into law on December 27th, 2020. One aspect of the act was the creation of a second Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF-II). HEERF-II provides funds to institutions for emergency grants to students whose lives have been disrupted by COVID-19 pandemic. Visit the HEERF Emergency Grants website to learn more.

CRRSAA requires all colleges and universities participating in the program to provide access to the following information.

- 1. MSOE has received funding as part of CRRSAA via the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund. MSOE acknowledges its assurance that it intends to use the funds received under Section 314(a)(1) of CRRSAA to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. MSOE's allocation is \$3,379,921 and will use \$1,142,631 to go directly to students.
