Wisconsin Veterans Education Grant (VetEd)

Who is eligible for VetEd?

The Wisconsin Veterans Education Grant program may be available to you if you are a Wisconsin veteran who has not yet been awarded a bachelor's degree.

To be considered for benefits, you must meet the following requirements:

- Have a household income of under \$50,000 plus \$1,000 for each dependent in excess of two dependents.
- Achieve and maintain a GPA of 2.0.

What are the benefits I will receive under VetEd?

Reimbursement is currently up to 100% of the tuition and fees not covered by Post 9/11 G.I. Bill, other grants, scholarships, or remissions. The maximum reimbursement is the equivalent of the UW-Madison tuition rate. For veterans who have been released from active duty service for more than ten years, this grant will only cover up to 11 credits.

Active Duty Time	Maximum Credits
90 to 180 Days	30 credits or two semesters
181 to 730 Days	60 credits or four semesters
731+ Days	120 credits or eight semesters

How do I apply?

The VetEd process begins with a meeting at your local County Veterans Service Office (CVSO). You will need to complete and submit the Veterans Education Grant Application no later than 60 days after the beginning of the term. This application can be found on the Wisconsin Dept. of Veterans Affairs website. Finally, MSOE will need you to complete and submit their Veteran Benefit Payment Agreement.
